Title: From theory to practice and back.

Abstract: Throughout my career as a theorist I have learned a lot from talking to practitioners. They often face situations in which they have to make recommendations but the data show inconsistencies and it is not clear how to resolve these. I will give two examples of such inconsistencies, one in health utility measurement the other in the value of life, how they can lead to better theory and how this better theory in turn leads to better policy.

Title: Household Formation and Intergenerational Economic Mobility.

Abstract: The household is recognized as a core institution for allocating resources across generations and is the unit from which a wide array of economic data is collected. But households are hardly static. Over the course of time, they separate and reform, and this process can have substantial implications for economic change. In this talk, I will discuss several papers that make use of long-term panel data from low and middle income countries to better understand how the formation and dissolution of households influences the intergenerational transmission of inequality.
